Following the incessant rain we experienced, it was nice to finally have a sunny day to enjoy the March 30 run. As a bonus for me, now that my medical driving restriction of seven months has been lifted, it was my first run behind the wheel of my beloved "IFFY".

At the same time, I'm incorporating the proper colour coded wiring for flashers (green with white trace RH, and green with red LH) so it will be all nice and neat. HAZ had flashers fitted previously but in a haphazard and crude fashion.

I also ventured into spray painting the side boards and the tray seat. However, my spray work will require the refined touch of someone more experienced, in the process, I scored a run record that Bradman would be proud of,








so there's definitely room for improvement.

The next phase is to install the running boards, which will allow me to accurately position the rear guards and determine the precise mounting points on the tray's side timber. Notably, this Ute stands out as the only example I've encountered with running boards; all other similar Utes I've seen feature curved rocker panels. The only reference to running boards on a Zed Ute comes from an old advertisement from Howards LTD that David kindly provided.

further details will follow.





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


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# Laidley Heritage Day
